

MAYWOOD SITE - REMEDIAL DESIGN/REMEDIAL ACTION IMPLEMENTATION PLAN, INFORMATIONAL COPY

Enclosed are four copies of the Remedial Design/Remedial Action Implementation Plan for cleanup of the Maywood Phase I Vicinity Properties. Because these activities will be conducted under removal action authority there is no longer a requirement under the Federal Facility Agreement to formally submit this document. However, as we have previously discussed, a copy is being provided to you for informational purposes.

Please note that the enclosed plan was not written to be a detailed, work controlling document. It provides a generic overview of our planned remediation activities, along with certain guidance information for work to be implemented through our existing procedures and task specific work instructions. The rationale for developing this document at this level of detail is because FUSRAP has a large framework of procedures in place that govern similar activities at all sites. Detailed work instructions or instruction guides are then developed for implementing work on a task specific basis.
