Subject: Maywood Site - DOE Acceptance of Stepan's Drummed Investigation Derived Waste

Dear Ms. Cange:

As you have requested, the following summarizes the points discussed at our meeting of 8/29/95 and the items for which we are requesting assistance from USDOE.

1. Review of Remedial Investigation Radiological Data. It is our understanding that Bechtel Environmental is currently reviewing the radiological data for the Sears property. The goal of the review is to establish whether the field screening procedure can be eliminated for that property, given the prevalence of radiological contamination.

2. Radiological Field Screening of IDW. Based on our discussions, DOE will supply a gamma spec for field screening of IDW and CH2M HILL will amend the current contract with TMA/Eberline to cover the cost of the technician operator. Assuming the availability of the equipment, the screening analysis for soils will be performed during the winter months, with shipment occurring in April-May 1996. At this time, we anticipate a schedule of approximately 2 - 3 weeks for soil screening. Dewatering and characterization of well cuttings will be done in the Spring, with shipment to follow.
